High School Boundary Steering Committee Endorses Two Scenarios

After studying community feedback about high school boundary changes in Poudre School District, the Boundary Steering Committee has created a boundary recommendation made up of two scenarios, which was presented to the Review Committee on April 10.

The boundary recommendation will be presented to PSD administrators later this month. The Superintendent's Cabinet will review the recommendation and Superintendent Dr. Jerry Wilson will make a decision by the end of May. New high school boundaries will be phased in beginning fall 2009.

PSD boundary committees began studying high school boundary changes last fall. After analyzing more than 20 high school boundary scenarios, four boundary proposals were presented at public meetings held in February and March.

New high school boundaries will help balance enrollment in PSD, and make room for ninth graders who are scheduled to enter high schools in 2009 when grade configuration changes are implemented.

A new boundary Steering Committee will be formed to analyze elementary and middle school boundaries beginning fall 2008. The new committee will include new members, as well as some existing Steering Committee members.
