The online School Choice application is now available online at www.psdschools.org under "School Registration." The first consideration deadlines for 2011-12 are:

- January 27, 2012, for secondary (grades 6-12)
- February 10, 2012, for elementary (grades K-5)

School Choice applications may be submitted after the first-consideration deadline until the first day of class at the beginning of the school year of requested enrollment. For more information, view the School Choice policy and timelines on the PSD website at www.psdschools.org.

7. PSD shares policy regarding treatment of students, parents

The PSD Board of Education Executive Limitation policy 2.1 assures the proper treatment of students, parents/guardians and the general public. The entire policy can be accessed at: www.psdschools.org/psdinfo/boardofeducation/policygovernancepolicies. To request that a copy be sent to you, please contact your child's school. A summary of the policy includes:

The Board of Education Executive Limitation policy 2.1 stresses the importance for PSD to: obtain public input in decision-making; collect appropriate information; safely store student information; assure discipline is appropriate and consistent; provide safe and accessible school facilities; provide equitable and reasonable access for non-disruptive activities; provide families with educational choices; clearly communicate student expectations; adhere to consistent and timely grading practices; be responsive to inquiries; never retaliate against students or parents; use written rules that state school expectations, standards and procedures; follow internal

grievance procedures and access the Board of Education if the policy is violated; and provide families with many ways to voice their concerns about the education of students.

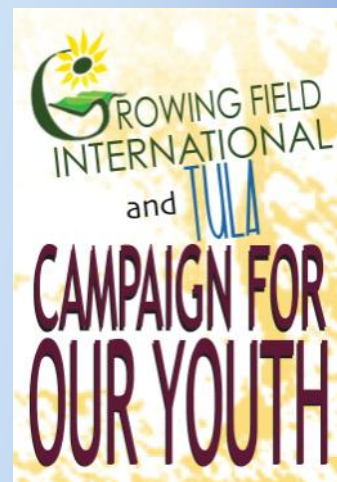

CUCUMBERS

The **cucumber** (*Cucumis sativus*) is a widely cultivated plant in the gourd family Cucurbitaceae, which includes squash, and in the same genus as the muskmelon.

The plant is a creeping vine which bears cylindrical edible fruit.

There are three main varieties of cucumber: "slicing", "pickling", and "burpless".

Within these varieties, several different cultivars have emerged.

The cucumber is originally from India, but is now grown on most continents.



Slicing-Cucumbers which are grown to be eaten fresh are called slicing cucumbers. They are mainly eaten in the unripe, green form.

Pickling-Cucumbers can be pickled for flavor and longer shelf-life. Although any cucumber can be pickled, commercial pickles are made from cucumbers specially bred for uniformity of length-to-diameter ratio and lack of voids in the flesh.

Burpless-Some varieties of cucumber are marketed as burpless, because the seeds and skin of other varieties of cucumbers are said to give some people gas. The burpless variety is reputed to be easy to digest, nearly seedless and have a pleasant taste.

They can grow as long as 2 feet .
