It is an honor for me to be the principal of Blevins, and it is my continued hope that together we can provide meaningful learning experiences in a socially and developmentally supportive environment for all students. It is our goal to help prepare our students with the “tools” and knowledge necessary to be engaged and well-informed citizens in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. You have my commitment to work hard, be thoughtful and to listen.

A strong educational experience cannot occur without all invested partners working together to achieve common goals. Please, please, please continue to use the designated student drop-off on the west side or behind Blevins. Please, Please, please do not use the east/front cul-de-sac for student pickup or drop-off when busses are present (7:15 – 7:40 am. and 2:15 – 2:45 pm before and after school). We ask that everyone observe the guidelines set forth in the flier for the safety and security of students, staff and community users of the Blevins building site and Taft Hill Road access.

The impact of state and district budget reductions over the last few years will continue to impact the Blevins and PSD community. We work diligently to have as little impact on the classroom as possible, but in the end Blevins will have fewer teachers and therefore, fewer class options. In addition, Blevins did reduce its classified staff in both the office and classroom support, and therefore other staff will assume these roles which result in reduced services in both areas. We will continue to serve our community to the best of our ability, but request your patience during busy times.

At this time, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Fort Collins community and Poudre School District voters for their continued support and passage of the 2010 Mill Levy and Bond. Even though all schools have had to “tighten their belt,” without the passage of these two initiatives PSD would have had to make deeper reductions that would have had a direct impact on the classroom. Thank you!

In this newsletter you will find all the information you will need to start the school year. Please pay particular attention to the specifics of 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade schedule/locker distribution. Please note that only the 6<sup>th</sup> graders will be attending school on Friday, August 19<sup>th</sup>, while 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders get one more day of summer and begin school on Monday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>. ## DRESS CODE INFORMATION

**Before buying new school clothes for your student, please review the Blevins Dress Code (taken directly from the Blevins Handbook).**

In effort to create an environment that focuses on student achievement, students are expected to dress in a manner that is not disruptive to the education or constitute a health or safety hazard. Rule of Thumb, if you have to ask yourself "Is my clothing school acceptable?" then it probably is not. School is the business and professional work environment for students. Clothing should be appropriate for school and school activities. Clothing and other forms of personal appearance should not distract from the learning environment and should not be intimidating. The following Dress Code guidelines have been developed.

Short shorts and Short skirts are not allowed. (At the discretion of administration).

Clothing must cover underwear, midriff, chest, back and buttocks.

Half shirts, see-through shirts, mesh shirts, halter-tops, tube tops, or any tops without a back will not be allowed.

Tank tops are not permitted—does not matter the width of the strap.

Caps, hats, bandanas, handkerchiefs, masks, chains, and sunglasses are not permitted to be worn during school hours, unless specific permission has been given by the administration.

Heavy coats/trench coats are not to be worn in school. These items should be stored in a student locker only; it is your responsibility to dress appropriately for the weather. Always have a sweater, sweatshirt or lightweight zip-up in your locker for cooler conditions.

Clothing or jewelry which promotes alcohol, drugs, tobacco, sexuality, profanity or anything that could be used as a weapon will not be allowed. (All at the discretion of administration).

Shoes must be worn at all times.

Drawings and/or writings on skin or clothing that are inappropriate for school or a distraction to the school environment are not allowed.

Tattoos must be covered at all times.

Any manner of grooming or apparel, including clothing, jewelry, hats, emblems, bandanas and badges, which by virtue of color, arrangement, trademark, or other attribute is associated with or denotes membership in or affiliation with any gang, will not be allowed. This includes color of clothing & brand names. (All at the discretion of administration).

Torn clothing is not allowed. (Tears above the knee in shorts or pants, is not allowed. (At the discretion of administration).

Sleep wear or lounge wear, including pajama pants, thin sweats and slippers are not allowed.

Certain school activities may be exempt from these guidelines with administrative approval.

Students found in violation of this policy will be subject to disciplinary action.

Student dress will be subject to the review and discretion of the building administrator (PSD JICA - Dress Code and Dress Code Violations)

### Student Snapshot on PSD website

The interactive "Student Snapshot" is available from the Parent Landing page on the PSD website. The Student Snapshot allows parents/guardians to view individualized information for their student(s) including grades, upcoming assignments, account balances, and school information. **Current Student Snapshot users may continue to use their existing account.** Parents who do not have an account may create one by clicking the "Create An Account" link, found on the Student Snapshot login page. To access information, parents need a unique activation code for each of their students. Activation codes generated in the Student Snapshot will be e-mailed to the head(s) of household on record in SILK, the PSD student information system. For questions or troubleshooting, call 490-3020 or e-mail [portalhelp@psdschools.org](mailto:portalhelp@psdschools.org).

- Call your child's school. School personnel will be occupied with taking care of students and will most likely not be able to answer the phone. Call the PSD Customer Service Center.
- Go to your child's school. Parents arriving at the school will cause unnecessary congestion and hinder school personnel from taking care of students. Parents will receive information and instructions on how to pick their children up via the methods previously listed.





## SPORTS INFORMATION

This year's athletic programs will get underway beginning August 8th for football, and August 16th for softball. **The 7th and 8th grade program** will consist of girls' softball, boys' football, boys' wrestling, girls' basketball, boys' basketball, girls' volleyball, girl's and boy's track, club tennis, and club golf. Reminder: All 6th grade students may participate in City Recreation sports

A 7th/8th grade football meeting for athletes and coaches is scheduled for 4:30 pm on Monday, August 8th in gym 101. The 7th/8th grade softball athletes will meet on the first day of school at 3:00 pm in gym 101.

The softball teams will consist of a Varsity team and Junior Varsity teams. If a student does not have his/her physical as of the first day of practice, but will be participating, they should watch the practice that day.

Every athletic participant **MUST** have a physical examination by a physician and insurance to try-out, practice, and compete in a sport. The physical form must be **ON FILE** in the office before he/she is eligible to compete. A student may not engage in any practice session until this procedure is completed. The physical forms are valid for a year from the examination date. It is advisable to arrange physicals well in advance of the sport in which your child is interested in. Students must be out for a sport within 5 school days of the beginning practice date. Please turn physical forms into the Blevins office starting August 8, 2011.

### Lunch program available to qualifying families

Applications for the federal free and reduced-price school lunch program were mailed home to all heads of households in late July/early August. Students participating in the program during the previous school year may be automatically enrolled in the program for the first 30 days of school. **Parents must submit a new family application each school year** and are required to complete only one application per household. The application may be returned to a school or to the Food Service Office. Identity of students participating is kept strictly confidential.

A letter of eligibility for free and reduced-price meals will be sent to the parents/guardians of qualifying students. An information release form will be included with the eligibility letter. Complete the information release form and return it to your school office/Deb Caskey. In order for any school fees to be waived we must have a copy of the completed eligibility letter. # ATTENDANCE PHONE #488-4088



Please note the attendance phone number is different from the main office. This line is open **24 hours each day**. Please do not leave a message on the machine that picks up on the regular school telephone number. Please be prepared with your student's ID number. In order to provide maximum service to you as a parent, and to our teaching staff, we would request that when your student is absent from school you call the attendance number **before** 8:00 am. **Please call each day your child is absent unless his/her absences are prearranged.** Homework requests need to be received before 8:30 am in order to be processed that day - **please call the attendance secretary at 488-4006 to make a homework request.**

When planning to excuse your student during the day for medical or dental appointments, a written note from a parent needs to be delivered to the attendance office, or a parent needs to come in and sign your child out. The student should take the note to the **attendance office (not to the teacher)** before 7:40 am to get a pass out of class. All students **TARDY** to school need to report to their 1st or 2nd period class before 7:50 am. After that time, students need to report to the attendance office. The expectation is that students will be on time to all classes. We also request that every effort be made by parents to schedule vacations or out of town trips during those times when school is NOT in session.

*One of the school goals is to attain a 95% attendance rate. We will actively pursue achieving this goal. Please understand our aggressive work to have all students in school and on time.*

### Procedure for Use of Drug Detection Dogs

Blevins will enlist the use of drug detection dogs on a random basis to go through hallways, classrooms and locker rooms. Students and staff have been informed that these searches will occur randomly throughout the school year.

Legal issues you need to be aware of include:  
If a dog sniff indicates the presence of drugs in a student locker or other confined space on the school premises, reasonable suspicion is established for an immediate further search of the space. When feasible, a videotape record of the search should be made. The student may be present at the option of the principal.

**The intent of this process is not to embarrass individuals, but to assure parents and the community that their school is free from drugs.**



## Back-To-School Night



We hope parents will plan to attend the Back-To-School Night that will be **Thursday, Sept 1st, 2011**. Beginning at 5:45 you may pick up CSAP scores. At 6:10pm, we will have an informational meeting in gym 101 and then report to classes by 6:30pm. We believe that you will benefit from visiting your child's classes, meeting teachers, and learning about the programs available at Blevins. Because of the space available, we request that parents leave their students at home. Parent Conferences will be at a later date, and we encourage you to bring your child(ren) at that time.

On September 1, PSD Child Nutrition Services will implement an online payment fee of \$1 per online transaction to cover the cost of credit card fees associated with the online payment of school meals. This fee will only apply to families using the online payment service. Parents will still have free online access to their child's account and be able to get free activity reports.

# PSD INFORMATION

## SCHOOL BUSES

Parents can access the PSD BUS SCHEDULE listing bus stops and times for each school on the PSD web site, [www.psdschools.org](http://www.psdschools.org) on Aug. 5th, and schedules will be available in the Blevins Office on Aug. 8th.

### Route numbers identify busses:

Students will determine their morning and afternoon bus based on the route number.

In most cases, the route number for your child's morning bus will be different than the route number for your child's afternoon bus.

The route number will be posted in the window closest to the entrance door of each bus.

### Cards/labels help students determine correct bus:

To help students learn their route numbers, students will be given a card/label when they get off of their morning bus at the beginning of the school year.

The card/label will have their morning bus route number and the afternoon bus route number and should aid students in finding the correct bus in the afternoon.

The card can be carried by the student until they remember their route numbers.

**Please encourage your child to ride the bus the first day of school so they can learn the new system.** School staff members, bus drivers, and additional transportation staff will help guide students to the correct busses the first couple days of school, until students are familiar with the process. If you have questions about bus routes, please contact the PSD transportation department at 970-490-3155 or visit the transportation web page at [www.psdschools.org](http://www.psdschools.org).

Space Available and Alternative Transportation applications will be available on August 1st on the PSD website. Requests are processed on 1st come, 1st served basis and are based on the space available on existing bus routes. Parents are encouraged to apply as soon as applications are available. ## **Student Rights and Code of Conduct**

The *Student Rights and Code of Conduct* will be distributed electronically for the 2011-12 school year.
